Half a Century of Impact under the 'Wake the Lake' Campaign - 50 Lakes Rejuvenated



We have reached a significant milestone with the launch of our 50th lake rejuvenation project at Kithaganur Lake, in Bengaluru under the 'Wake the Lake' campaign.

United Way Bengaluru's lake restoration efforts began in 2011 as a volunteering initiative. This experience led us to develop a dedicated flagship program, 'Wake the Lake'. Today, we've successfully embarked on our 50th lake rejuvenation project, impacting urban and rural areas.





Solar Solutions: Life in the Light



In Kaverinagar village, the villagers lived in fear of nocturnal elephant invasions. These elephants would routinely enter the village at night, causing havoc by trampling crops and damaging homes. The villagers' anxiety peaked when one tragic incident resulted in the death of a cow and the loss of vital crops for a local farmer.



In the village of Kothakondapalli, women once faced the challenge of being confined to their homes after sunset due to the absence of street lighting. Stepping outside after 6 PM was fraught with risks, severely limiting their social interactions and freedom.



As a mother of two daughters and a young son, Saraswati grappled with constant worry. Her daughters attended tuition classes three kilometres away and returned home after dark, navigating poorly lit streets and facing potential dangers lurking in the darkness.



Addressing the above challenges, **United Way Bengaluru** in collaboration with CSR partner **Caterpillar** installed solar streetlights at three remote gram panchayats in Krishnagiri District. Our team reached to understand the need to install the lights in these remote areas, overcoming rugged terrain to install the lights where vehicles couldn't go.

Here's what we have achieved

- Addressed challenges from daily threats by elephants, snakes, and insects, enhancing safety and livelihoods.
- Improved safety for women and children, and protected livestock and crops.









From GendHer Training to Classroom Impact



Commitment to Early Childhood Development in Raichur

In collaboration with CSR partners, **Broadcom**, **GEBE**, **Apotex**, **41 Anganwadi Centres** (**AWCs**)in Raichur, an aspirational district, were strengthened through various initiatives, as illustrated in the infographic below. Anganwadi Workers (AWWs) received capacity-building training and a new training centre was established to carry out learning and development activities for AWWs.

Celebrating Milk Day

Children from 40 Anganwadi Centres visited a nearby goshala (cow shed) to witness first-hand milking process. To create awareness on the importance of milk products, mothers were encouraged to bring various milk products to the Anganwadi centres, educating children about their nutritional benefits.

The event was celebrated across **40 centres** supported by the **HCL Foundation**, bringing **284 mothers** and **700 children** together in a joyful and educational experience.







Transformation from Barren Land to Lush Forest



James Godfrey-Faussett, Lead SUGi Forest Maker, said, "Within a forest, biodiversity means balance, birds control pests, insects pollinate plants, and beneficial fungi keep the trees healthy. Every organism has a role to play, and all these roles interact. And if you build a healthy, biodiverse habitat that can look after itself, it becomes self-sustaining. You can step away and let nature get to work."





The photo from 2019 shows the barren land at Dr MH Marigowda Botanical Garden at Doddasagere, Koratagere in the Tumkur district of Karnataka. By 2023, this once barren land has been transformed into a lush forest, spread over 250 acres and surrounded by villages and farmland.

United Way of Bengaluru, with support from **Mphasis** and the **Department of Horticulture**, **Government of Karnataka**, initiated the botanical garden development project to enhance the management and governance of the garden through dense forestation and water conservation measures.

This initiative has resulted in the planting of **100,000 saplings** of **45 diverse native species**. These efforts aim to improve biodiversity, ecological health, natural habitat, and moisture levels in the area.



Sustainable Initiatives at the Police Training School, Thanisandra

In partnership with **ANZ**, **United Way Bengaluru** has undertaken significant initiatives to address water scarcity and promote biodiversity at the Police Training School in Thanisandra. These efforts include the construction of an open well, percolation wells and the creation of a Miyawaki forest.



The **open well** has become an essential resource during times of water scarcity, providing a reliable water source benefiting over **1,000 community members** in the area.



The **percolation wells** have proven to be highly effective during heavy rainfall, thus mitigating the risk of water shortages.



Additionally, the **Miyawaki forest**, known for its dense and diverse plantings, has significantly increased the greenery on campus and promoted biodiversity.

Through these initiatives, we aim to alleviate water scarcity, improve groundwater recharge, and foster biodiversity, ensuring long-lasting environmental benefits for the community.







Ancient Survivors - Having existed for over 50 million years, mangroves have adapted to significant changes in sea levels and climate.

Global Distribution and Diversity - Mangroves are found in 123 countries and territories, covering a total area of over 150,000 square kilometers.

Nurseries of the Sea - Mangrove forests serve as nurseries for many marine species, including commercially important fish and crustaceans.

Underground Carbon Storage - They sequester up to five times more carbon than tropical rainforests, primarily in their root systems and soil.

Wave and Storm Surge Protection - Their dense roots and branches act as natural barriers, reducing wave energy and protecting coastlines.





Finding Purpose and Reconnecting with the Community

The 'Rural Rising' integrated rural development program, focuses on supporting livelihood initiatives in rural and aspirational districts. One of the notable success stories is Imanavel's journey from confinement to confidence and from dependence to dignity.

A resident of Kurdi Gram Panchayat in Manvi taluka, Raichur district, for the past 30 years, Imanavel had been confined to his house with 75% locomotor disability. His wife is a wage labourer, and his son, also impaired, works seasonally. Their annual income was less than Rs. 60,000.

With the support from CSR partner **Apotex India**, Imanavel received a bunk shop, enabling him to sell snacks. Wanting to grow his business, he constructed a makeshift shelter adjacent to the shop to rest during the afternoons, avoiding the need to travel back home. This intervention boosted his family's income to Rs. 800-1200 daily, allowing them to repay loans and cover expenses.

Beyond financial improvement, Imanavel found renewed purpose and community connection, highlighting the true impact of the initiative.

A scalable and sustainable approach towards Early Childhood Care and Education

Success in any intervention hinges on a unified team with a shared vision. Our Rural Rising program in the Wayanad district, an aspirational district in Kerala, aimed to create a nurturing learning environment for children, particularly from tribal communities.

One of our key efforts was to build a robust foundation by empowering Anganwadi Workers (AWWs), who closely work with children at the Anganwadi Centres and play a crucial role in implementing the ICDS scheme. Scaling this effort rapidly required a strategic approach.

We created a cadre of master trainers. By training 4 Child Development Project Officers (CDPOs) and 31 supervisors, we swiftly mobilized them to train 874 AWWs across 23 gram panchayats and 3 municipalities.

These trained AWWs are making a significant contribution to the lives of **13,000 children** between **3-6 years** who are enrolled in the Angawadi centres.

Our heartfelt thanks to the District Administration of Wayanad for their support and guidance throughout this transformative journey.







International Plastic Bag Free Day

On May 25, 2024, we joined forces with **Telstra** for a meaningful lake clean-up and plantation drive at Hullahali Lake, Bengaluru. The event was further enriched by the LGBTQ+ community from Pride Cafe, who added a special touch with their refreshment stall.

It was inspiring to see people from diverse backgrounds come together with a shared mission.





Driving Change with Data


However, putting this into practice requires consistent effort in reaching out to various internal stakeholders, explaining the concepts and their usefulness, and gaining their support. The principles of rigor and outcome are fundamental to this vertical.

Last year, the team completed nearly sixty studies across education, rural development, and environmental sectors, including needs assessment, baseline and end-line evaluations, pre-and post-training assessments, and post-training follow-up evaluations.

In the first quarter of fiscal year 2024-25, the team has conducted over ten needs assessment studies in various regions, including Bihar, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, and Karnataka. They have also started three extensive baseline evaluations in Wayanad district in Kerala, Chikkaballapura district in Karnataka, and Coimbatore district in Tamil Nadu.

My team has completed practical onsite training in each vertical of Rural Development, Environment, and Education projects. This has made them well-rounded professionals capable of handling assessments in any vertical, bringing great flexibility to the team."

"As the saying goes, "Measure what matters" is exactly what the Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) team at United Way of Bengaluru does. They track and measure project progress and benefits (in a more complicated term called 'Evaluation'). So does this add any value? Yes, but only if the information converted into data is used by the stakeholders. The value of M&E data is directly proportional to the usage of data!



It is crucial to instill a data-driven mindset in every employee within a growing organization, and the Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) vertical at UWBe is working hard to achieve that.

About Us


